

The Nursing Council of Kenya (NCK) joined regulatory bodies and health stakeholders from across the East African Community (EAC) for the East African Workshop on the Harmonization of Regulation for Healthcare Workers, held in Mombasa.

The workshop focused on aligning regulatory frameworks, promoting mutual recognition of qualifications, and enhancing healthcare worker mobility across the region. These efforts are critical to strengthening health systems and improving service delivery.

NCK was represented by CEO and Registrar, Dr. Lister Onsongo, Chairperson, Professor Eunice Ndirangu, and Council Board Members. Their participation demonstrated Kenya's leadership in advancing regulatory excellence and professional standards.

Dr. Onsongo emphasized:

"This workshop is a major step toward a unified regulatory approach in East Africa. Innovations such as digital licensure, harmonized curricula, and regional exams are empowering health professionals to serve more effectively across borders."

The workshop concluded with a firm commitment from participants to implement agreed strategies and continue regional collaboration. NCK remains at the forefront of regulatory reform, working toward a well-governed, competent, and mobile health workforce across East Africa.

STRENGTHENING NURSING & MIDWIFERY LEADERSHIP - GWHP

TRANSFORMATIVE IMPACT OF A NATIONAL TRAINING PROGRAMME

In 2024, the Nursing Council of Kenya (NCK), in partnership with the Florence Nightingale Foundation (FNF), delivered a national leadership development programme targeting mid-level nurse and midwife managers across all 47 counties.

Supported by the UK Department of Health and Social Care and managed by Global Health Partnerships, the initiative aimed to build leadership capacity, enhance retention, and improve healthcare delivery.

Programme Highlights

- 50 nurse and midwife leaders trained in intensive face-to-face and virtual sessions
- 500+ professionals reached through national monthly webinars
- 25 mentorship pairs formed with UK-based Kenyan diaspora nurses (KENMA-UK)
- QI projects conducted across maternal health, IPC, clinical care, staff development, and more

Transformative Results

- **96%** of participants reported feeling "very" or "extremely" confident in leadership (up from 18%)
- **85%** applied new leadership skills in their practice

- 97% said the programme positively influenced their decision to stay in the profession
- Measurable outcomes from QI projects included:
 - ◆ Increased skilled birth attendance (e.g., from 37% to 50.9% in Narok West)
 - ◆ Improved infection prevention control
 - ◆ Enhanced staff motivation and retention

Lessons and Next Steps

Despite challenges—such as tight timelines and limited QI expertise—the programme was a success thanks to strong partnerships and adaptable delivery. Key recommendations include:

- **Expand training duration** and integrate more experiential learning
- **Promote train-the-trainer models** for sustainability
- **Share QI projects with County Governors** for replication
- **Align future programmes with Kenya Health Policy 2024–2030**

Looking Ahead

NCK and FNF will present their results at the International Council of Nurses (ICN) Congress in Helsinki, Finland in June 2025. A new joint proposal is also underway to scale the programme to Malawi, extending its impact across East Africa.

Participants expressed appreciation for the opportunity to engage directly with industry leaders and deepen their understanding of the nursing profession.








NCK NOVEMBER 2024 LICENSURE EXAMINATION SERIES

The November 2024 NCK Online Licensure Examination was conducted from 11th to 14th November 2024 in 19 Examination centres across the country.

A total of 5266 candidates were examined in various programmes, with a total of 14 cadres being examined during the November Examination series.

In fulfillment of its mandate under Cap 257 of the Laws of Kenya Section 9(1) (f) that states, "with the approval of the Cabinet Secretary, to prescribe and conduct examinations for persons seeking registration or enrolment under this Act", the Council adopted Online Center Based Examinations. The examinations are held in approved Exam across the Country.

The Council is responsible for ensuring that all nurses and midwives within its jurisdiction meet an acceptable level of competence before they begin to practices. This level of competence is measured partly by the licensing exam.

The online licensure examination is a multiple-choice questions examination, and upon passing the national examination, successful candidates are eligible to apply for registration and licensing following the release of the results.

Once registration and licensing is completed, nurses and midwives are entered into the Council's registers and/or rolls and provided with a registration certificate and a practicing license.

APPROVED TRAINING INSTITUTIONS

The Nursing Council of Kenya is responsible for approving programmes of study for the nursing and midwifery professions. To date, the Council has approved 144 nursing and midwifery training institutions to train students at degree, and basic & post basic diploma levels for various specialty areas of nursing and midwifery practice

The Council has provided Standards of Nursing Education in Kenya and the Education Policy to provide a framework of reference for the nursing and midwifery education programmes in the country in preparing safe and competent nurse and midwife practitioners who will function effectively not only as members but also as leaders in health care delivery system.

We perform accreditation of programmes/courses. Any school, college or institution

intending to offer nursing and/or midwifery education programme for the purpose of preparing individuals to be awarded certificate, diploma or degree in nursing and/or midwifery is required to seek approval from the Nursing Council of Kenya. The Council shall conduct monitoring of programme implementation and adherence to quality training to ensure that the institution continues to maintain the set standards of nursing and midwifery practice as stipulated in the Standards of Nursing Education and Practice in Kenya.

- **Initial approval:** Official recognition granted for a new programme after the Council conducts a visit to the institution to ascertain its readiness to admit students.
- **Renewal:** Done upon expiration of the initial approval (after 5 years). The Council shall conduct an evaluation visit to ensure that the institution continues to maintain the set standards.
